Notes on Candlelighting:

Please tilt the unlit candle when lighting so that the lit candle remains upright and does not spill melted wax. Battery operated candles are available for younger children. Please see an usher for one.

Please separate the candle and holder when leaving the sanctuary and place them in their respective bins.

You may wonder why we light candles on Christmas Eve. The center candle in the Advent Wreath is known as the Christ Candle. It remains unlit until Christmas Eve and symbolizes Jesus, the light of the world, coming and permeating the darkness. As we each receive the light from the Christ Candle, through our neighbor, it symbolizes the way in which God brings the light of Christ into each of our hearts, and our responsibility to then pass it on. Are you a light in the darkness? Are you proclaiming the Kingdom of God to a world which is held in the dominion of darkness and death? Let us bring the hope, peace, joy, and love of Jesus to those around us in the coming year, even as we pass the light of the Christ Candle around our sanctuary tonight.
